

Did you know?

66% of Millennials don't know what Auschwitz is.

Because we love Israel, we support the ministry of *Christian Friends of Israel*. Each quarter a ministry magazine called **"For Zions Sake"** is sent to NCC (free) to share with you all that the Lord is doing through this great missions organization. Through the ministry, many "operations" provide much needed assistance to the remaining holocaust survivors as well as the Jewish people as a whole.

At NCC we challenge you to pray for the peace of Jerusalem and those that live there.

A survey taken by The Claims Conference in April last year, revealed that 31% of Americans believe that less than two million people were killed during the Holocaust, while the percentage reaches 41% among so-called millennials. In addition, 22% of millennials (one in five) had not heard about the Holocaust.

On January 27th, 1945 the Auschwitz concentration and extermination camp was liberated. In 2005, the United Nations designated this date to remember the Nazi massacre.



According to the figures one million Jews, between 70,000 and 75,000 Poles, 21,000 Gypsies, 15,000 Soviet prisoners of war and between 10,000 and 15,000 people included in the category of "others" were murdered in Auschwitz-Birkenau. Totaling 1.1 million people in all.

## Avi Yaron, an Israeli Inventor Who Invented a Surgical Tool to Save His Own Life.

Yaron was 26 when his motorcycle crashed in 1993 and he was rushed to the hospital. While he was undergoing an MRI to verify the damage, doctors discovered a tumor in the middle of his brain. "Avi, you will survive," the doctors said. "But you need immediate surgery that will probably leave you disabled, paralyzed, cognitive dysfunction, and epilepsy. Yaron, who was at the time a student of electrical engineering, was defeated. "Before that, I was in good health, I was active, I had a lot of life," he says. "I refused surgery. I don't know if it was intuition or pure denial, but that decision saved my life. He began to research about his condition. He investigated what technologies were available in the world: in Israel, Europe and the United States. He finally found a doctor in New York who would remove the tumor. But the tumor began to grow again. "There were endoscopes (the surgical tool used to guide) that lacked the required 3D depth perception." It took another two years to come up with a prototype and another 10 years to create a commercial product. But the product has already been adopted by surgeons around the world and the company has been growing steadily. The future of medicine, he says, lies in "predictive development, preventive systems based on emotional factors. That's my challenge now. Today, Yaron is 51 years old and healthy. Finally, it wasn't his company's technology that eliminated the last fragments of resistant tumors in his brain, but three additional surgeries in three different countries: Germany, Israel and New York. Yaron currently volunteers to train patients with brain tumors.



Although Yaron doesn't provide medical advice, his condition taught him "a lot about humility," he says. "I'm here to serve you".
