Sunday, Father's Day, Pastor Alli preached the following message "Learning From Our Past Fathers": With God, all things are possible! We learn from Adam to obey, and take blame when it is due. We learn intimacy with God is key. Even when you sin, God sees and still wants your heart to be for Him because of His great love for you. Let's consider the following examples of great and godly fathers found in the bible.

We can learn from Abraham that obedience pays off. God truly knows the right timing. Don't be impatient or crumble under fear. God has a way out or will give you the strength you need to make it through.

We learn from Isaac that we have a choice to follow in our father's sin or we can change the future. Also we learn not to favor one child more than another.

We learn from Jacob not to be impatient with God even when it looks like things are not in your favor. Sowing and reaping is not always what you want.

Noah teaches us to walk out the call, even when it's long and lonely. He teaches us that God cares about our kids even when they are not serving God like they should. He also teaches us that our kids are watching us all the time.

Moses teaches us that even though he was adopted that God knows best. He teaches us that even with shortcomings, God can use you to change a nation and to set it free. Remember to follow all of God's instructions so we see our promise land.

David shows man's lack of self control and need to hide our sin even unto death. He also shows us how to repent and stay close to God even when we don't feel like we deserve it. David praises God in the good. Seeks Him in the bad, and worships Him at all costs.

God, your ultimate Father, is the most forgiving, loving Father who is full of grace and mercy. He will do whatever it takes to protect you. He is invested in you. He has purpose for you despite any weakness. He sees you in

the good and the bad and wants fellowship and honesty. He wants your whole heart. And with that you are a great father, because you have destiny.

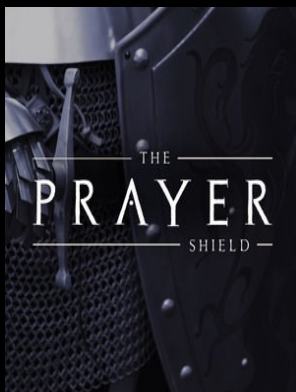
