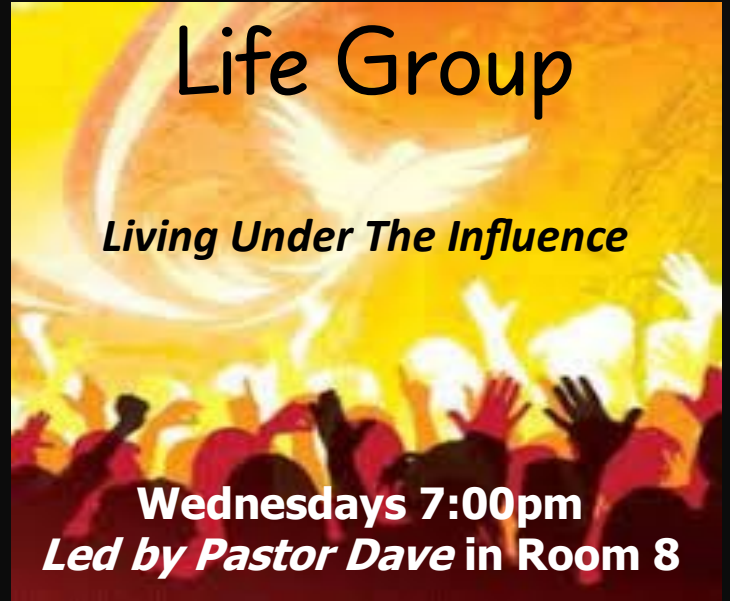

From the Desk of Elder Mike Folsom: "Multiplication" (From Sunday's Sermon)



About three months ago, I told my wife that I was tired of living the same way. By that, I meant, I want more of a relationship with God. I want to be close to God, I want more from God, I want to hear from God more, I want more word, more spirit, more fruit, more power. I want to have the fruit of the spirit. I want to live an abundant life and a supernatural life in a greater way.

We have to surrender. We have to yield to the Spirit and change. The change has to be spiritual. Over these last three months, Judy and I, have changed our morning routine. We use to get up and watch Joseph Prince and then watch some more guys. We go to our reading spot and we read. We study the Word and we talk about the scriptures with each other. Most nights, I read to Judy before we go to bed. Seeking to know God, have a closer relationship, seeking direction, seeking breakthroughs. If you expect different results, you have to do things differently. Its been an exciting journey that we have been on the last three months.

From Matthew 25:14-29 "The Parable of the Talents"..

As we think about this parable, Jesus is the Master. The servants are us. Does the Master want his money to multiply? Does he want more of those who multiply? He is trusting His servants to be faithful and multiply. He is not micro managing us. He expects us to do it on our own. He will inspect what we have done when He returns. We have been given a significant responsibility to use what God has given us.

The Lord says in Matthew 25:21 'Well done, good and faithful servant; you were faithful over a few things, I will make you ruler over many things. Enter into the joy of your lord.' What He is saying is faithfulness is multiplication. Multiplication is addition on steroids.

Here are three things we can do with our lives:
1. We can spend our life to build the kingdom. We can be a witness, we can be a soul winner. We can pour our life into others. Give your resources to others who are serving. Our first mission field is our family. We can love and serve others. We can believe God and step out into the kingdom of righteousness, peace and joy. That is the kingdom of God.
2. We can take our gifts and build ourselves up.
3. Or we can just neglect all of it.

So what are we going to do with our lives with surrendering all to Jesus? Believe in Jesus—receive Him—let Him take control. Let's not settle or maintain. Let's step out in faith to use our gifts and talents for what God wants to do with them.

I surrender all, all to Jesus, I surrender. Believe, obey, and watch what He will do.
